3. Information on future meetings

2018 Budapest, Hungary (Miklós Tóth). The date will be August 12-18, 2018. It will be co-organized by Miklós Tóth (Plant Protection Institute, Centre for Agriculture Research, Hungarian Academy of Sciences) and Zoltán Imrei (Hungarian Plant Protection Society). The venue will be Hotel Flamenco, located in the city centre and near the Agricultural University. JCE is already the official journal of the International Society of Chemical Ecology (ISCE) and the Asia-Pacific Association of Chemical Ecologists (APACE)

The Editor-in-Chief Garry W. Felton supports affiliation with ALAEQ and the ISCE Executive Committee and the Councilors approved the idea unanimously.

- **8.** Journal of Chemical Ecology, Editor-in-Chief's report (Garry W. Felton)

 The transfer of duties between John Romeo and Gary Felton took effect after the January issue. John Romeo was awarded for his outstanding service to the society (Outstanding Service Award).
 - J. Chem. Ecol. is running under the same rules as earlier. In spite the IF dropped from 3.15 to 2.36 this year, all hope that it will not be a trend, rather a fluctuation. The rejection rate is 70 %. Obtaining reviews is time

consuming & difficult, time to decision needs to improve. The editor gets a significant number of manuscripts that are not relevant to the journal. We need more high quality submissions. Two special issues are planned for next year. The Editor-in-Chief would like to add an additional Associate Editor. His/her field of expertize is subject of discussion.
