10th ANNUAL MEETING - CALL FOR PAPERS

The 10th annual ISCE meeting will be held July 31-August 4, 1993 at the Sheraton Sand Key Resort on Clearwater Beach, Florida. There will be five symposia and contributed paper sessions (See conference schedule, next page). Clearwater Beach is reached by flying to Tampa International Airport and then taking a 20 minute shuttle van to the beach. The area is a major world tourist destination (See October,1992 Newsletter). Consider bringing your families or significant others!

Each scientific session will consist of presentations by invited speakers and regular contributed papers. Major talks will be 30 min. with 10 min. for questions. Contributed papers will be 12 min. with 3 min. for discussion. Poster presentations will include symposium themes as well as general chemical ecology. Papers on all aspects of chemical ecology are solicited.

Abstracts Participants wishing to present a paper (oral or poster) should complete the enclosed "Abstract form" and return it no later than June 1, 1993. Abstracts will not be retyped so please carefully follow the instructions on the form and use the sample format.

Registration To participate in the conference complete the "Registration form" and return this by June 1, 1993.
Registration for ISCE members is \$110 US. Your remittance must be a bank draft or money order drawn upon a US bank. Make checks payable to "10th Annual ISCE Meeting".

Accommodations Rooms at special group rates have been reserved at the Sheraton Sand Key Resort where all sessions will take place. The hotel is on the beach. The price of a room is \$76 U.S. per night. Each room has two double beds. Up to 2 adults and 2 children may share a room. You must make your reservations directly with the hotel. Fill out the "Hotel reservation form" and return it by June 30, 1993.

PRESIDENT'S LETTER

The Past-Presidents of the ISCE, Wittko Francke and Jacques Pasteels, initiated efforts to award His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej of Thailand with the Natura Pro Futura Medal for his efforts in the Conservation of Biodiversity. Professors Francke and I went to Bangkok on January 26, 1993 and presented the medal to the King at Chitlada Palace. Details will be reported by Prof. Francke in the next issue of the newsletter.

The procedures for elections and nominations of officers of ISCE are described in the bylaws of the Society (see Membership Directory). This year we must elect a new Vice-President and also a Secretary. John Romeo's three-year term as Secretary will be finished in August. We all must thank him and congratulate him for the excellent job he has done for the Society. He would consider doing another term if elected, but others are encouraged to submit their names if interested in this position. Jacques Pasteels, as Past-President, chairs the Nominating Committee. The Chair of the 1994 Silver Medal Award is Vice-President William Fenical. Nominations for this award should be supported by several members. They should reach Dr. Fenical by April 1, 1993. The final selection will be done by the Councilors and the Executive Committee in Tampa, Florida in August.

Our fund-raising campaign has been successful in receiving about \$24,000 from various chemical, pharmaceutical, flavor and food industries. We will continue our efforts to increase our financial capacity for the betterment of ISCE.

JEAN-MARIE DELWART FOUNDATION PRIZE - BIOLOGY OF COMMUNICATION AWARD

The Jean-Marie Delwart Foundation has two main objectives: 1. Chemical communication in animals and man. 2. The emergence of ethical behavior on the basis of the biological evolution of conducts as they are studied in human ethology. The Foundation promotes and supports scientific research in these two fields by means of an award which is granted every 2 years. The Prize, \$10,000 will be awarded in 1993 to a "study or a series of studies, individual or collective, already published (or accepted for publication) corresponding to the above 2 objectives. The Foundation believes that "the experimental study of chemical communication in animals and especially in invertebrates constitutes the most important development of ethology in the last few years.
