

The ISCE travel award committee (Drs. Dr. Juraj Harmatha, Dr. Yoko Naya, and Nancy Targett (Chair)) announces its call for applications for student travel awards to the 11th annual ISCE meeting in Syracuse, NY. This year the level of funding that ISCE is making available for the student travel awards is \$6,000. The awards are available on a competitive basis to graduate students and postdoctoral research associates. To be eligible for an ISCE travel award you must:

- Be a paid-up student member of the ISCE and still be enrolled as a full-time graduate student OR be a paid-up member of the ISCE and be a full-time postdoctoral research associate.
- Present a paper or poster at the meeting.
- Not have previously received an ISCE travel grant.

To apply, students or postdocs must complete the enclosed form and send three copies, postmarked no later than 31 March 1994 to Dr. Nancy M. Targett, Chair, ISCE Student Travel Awards Committee, Graduate College of Marine Studies, University of Delaware, 700 Pilottown Rd. Lewes, DE. U.S.A. Applicants will be informed of the committee's decision no later than 1 May 1994.

BOOKS - ISCE Members

Bernard Fried (Life Member ISCE) and Joseph Sherma have published the revised and expanded 3rd edition of Thin-Layer Chromatography - Techniques and Applications. The book reflects many recent developments in thin layer chromatography and details various qualitative and quantitative densitometric TLC experiments on organic dyes, lipids, amino acids, carbohydrates, natural pigments, vitamins, nucleic acid derivatives, steroids, pharmaceuticals, organic acids, antibiotics, and insecticides. The book is an excellent, well-illustrated, practi-

cally oriented text with an overview of current TLC equipment and an up-to-date literature coverage. It is published by Marcel Dekker, Inc, New York, has 464 pages and costs \$165.00 U.S. 1994.

Phytochemical Potential of Tropical Plants, Volume 27 of the series Recent Advances in Phytochemistry edited by Kelsey Downum, John Romeo, and Helen Stafford has

been published by Plenum Press, New York. The book is based on papers presented by invited speakers at the 2nd joint meeting of the Phytochemical Society of North America and the Phytochemical Society of Europe which was held in Miami in August 1992 just two weeks before Hurricane Andrew destroyed much of the meeting site and the Fairchild Botanical Garden there. Topics explored in the volume include: strategies for locating plants with specific biological properties; use of chemical/biological techniques for the development of novel pharmaceuticals and pesticides for lead phytochemicals; evaluation of plant chemicals as medicinals and insecticides; studies of the phytochemical diversity of promising tropical plant families; and use of medicinal plants by primates other than man. In addition to Downum and Romeo, who organized the symposium, other ISCE contributors are Eloy Rodriguez, John Arnason, Bernard Philogene, Murray Isman, Isao Kubo, and Peter Waterman. The book has 299 pages and costs \$79.50. 1993.
